



MISSION

Our main mission is to work with marginalized communities of citizens in an unconventional artistic way using the means of theatre, performing arts, dance or singing.

Theatre with No Home (hereinafter referred to as "DBD") provides a platform for presenting various social topics that are being overlooked in the commercial artistic sphere. We combine the artistic and social action to help break down stereotypes that marginalized communities face in the society.

DBD was informally founded in 2004 during work on theatrical projects with people without home and it became registered with the Ministry of Interior of the Slovak Republic on 12 May 2006 under the registration number VVS/1-900/90-28231. Members of the organization are people, who have been in the long term engaged in the social, educational, or artistic practice, economy, management, and advertising. We are based in Bratislava. Currently, we have nine members, several volunteers, and many supporters.

Our acting community includes people without home, people with disability, people from socially underprivileged communities, social workers, theatre artists and all those interested in our theatre. Our actors and actresses receive financial compensation for rehearsals and for performing in our theatrical performances.

- provide people without home and people with disabilities with a space for meaningful leisure, personal development, self-realization, and presentation
- offer art available to the public regardless of social or financial situation
- promote the idea of "theatre is also a work"
- involve 12 actors/actresses in regular rehearsals and play performances

- DBD performances was offered to the public based on free entry
- DBD participated in cultural life in the Bratislava's Old Town Centre of Culture and Education in the Pisztory Palace. At the same time DBD promoted art emerging in Bratislava's Old Town
- we made visible the artistic work of socially disadvantaged or excluded people





ČISTÉ ZVIERA (staged reading)

The main objectives of the project:

- to create, rehearse, premiere, and repeat staged readings of the original Slovak prose, short stories Čisté zviera from Uršula Kovalyk. Stage reading is performed by people with no home, people with physical disabilities and otherwise socially excluded people
- show staged reading during International festival of homeless theatre ERROR 2019
- show the staged reading for the public

Project duration:

January – December 2019

The most important activities within the project:

- creation of an acting team, reading the book, analyzing texts
- drama therapy rehearsals, selection of short stories for the actual staged reading, creation of the performative elements, costume practices, design and production of the scenes and costumes
- design and production of bulletins, posters
- public relation activities
- opening night in Pisztory Palace in Bratislava

Project results:

- nontraditional stage reading was rehearsed, premiered, and reprised, which spreads the idea of the importance of reading literature in a non-traditional, theatrical way
- DBD actively involved 9 people without home and 2 people with severe disabilities in the performance
- by involving people with risk of poverty and social exclusion into the stage reading DBD is actively influencing the audience with aim to make public poverty and social exclusion sensitive

The staged reading from Uršuľa Kovalyk's book reflects the internal conflicts of various women resulting from the stress of civilization, interpersonal relationships, social stereotypes and aging in the big city. ERROR 2019 INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL OF HOMELESS THEATERS

The main objectives of the project:

The ERROR International Festival of Homeless Theaters is the only festival in Europe focused on theaters played by homeless people. It creates a space where drama groups working with marginalized groups of the population can present original theatrical productions to the public. It raises the profile of various social issues that professional theater often does not address. It is a platform where majority meets people who are socially and culturally excluded from society. It helps to break down stereotypes that exist towards people with no home and helps in their resocialization process. In 2019, the 13th edition of the festival took place.

The invitation to the festival was accepted by homeless and community theaters from the Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland, and Slovakia.

The ERROR 2019 festival was opened by **the mayor** of Bratislava Matúš Vallo and took place under the auspices of the mayor of Bratislava-Old City town Zuzana Aufrichtová.

HEROES OF INCLUSION AND TRANSFORMATION

The main objectives of the project:

- to expand and develop the competences of educators, support and expand social inclusion and empowerment
- to create an online manual with different methods for people working in the field of continuing education.
 Especially in the field of non-formal education of disadvantaged or vulnerable people,
 based on the Paul Rebillot Hero's Journey process and DBD own experience with this holistic process
- to develop, test, apply, explain, and describe non-formal learning methods that combine educational, expressive (art, theater, music, dance / movement), therapeutic and prevention techniques, with the aim of helping people to orientate themselves in their lives
- cooperate with 5 partner organizations Adventure Life (Austria), Spolek divadelních ochotníků Alois Jirásek (Czech Republic), Asociación cultural, social, de salud y bienestar ACUNAGUA (Spain), Grupa za podrsku mladim LGB osobami "IZADI" (Serbia), Reykjavíkur Akademían (Iceland)
- from 5 cooperationg partner groups each organization will focus on one step of the process and try to link the basic structure of this step with its own practical activity in the field of non-formal education and with the methods and techniques, which will be used for this process. As result this will be describe.


HEROES OF INCLUSION AND TRANSFORMATION

- The result of the project is an open educational resource – an electronic book Among Heroes and Demons, which is available in an online PDF version and distributed in 2 language versions via the Internet, websites of partner organizations, or associated sites. The publication is intended for educators, trainers, teachers, counselors, therapists, social workers, social, cultural, and artistic activists who work with disadvantaged people. At the same time the publication is designated for people trying to find, express and live-in accordance with their identity. In addition, for public and private organizations and institutions active in the field of education
- more comprehensive approach to the creation of intellectual output was achieved by involving a wide range of partners with different target groups in the field of non-formal education enabled
- the transnational nature of the project has had and continues to have a far-reaching and significant impact on the dissemination of project results at European level

The main objectives of the project:

- reduce prejudice and intolerance towards people experiencing homelessness and housing exclusion in the Visegrad countries through comprehensive awareness-raising activities to increase the social inclusion of homeless people
- involve homeless people in the position of experts with real experience
- get to know other involved awareness raising programs and other organizations in the region through 4 project meetings and visits
- partner organizations plan to play a total of 8 theater performances and realize 9 local events in the V4 countries, the aim of which is to directly address and sensitize various groups of society on the topic of homelessness



DOBRÁ KRAJINA THEATRE WITH NO HOME TOOK PART ON DONORS PROGRAM DOBRÁ KRAJINA

The main objectives of the project:

- Involve 12 actors in their regular drama shows
- show drama once a month for public free of charge (10 performances in total)
- increase the self-confidence and social skills of DBD actors / actresses
- to initiate and realize either immediately after the theatrical performance or as part of the performance a short interaction (debate) of actors and actresses with the audience
- improve the financial situation of actors and actresses
- give positive visibility to the artistic work of the homeless and people with disabilities
- help actors and actresses with physical disabilities

Project duration:

January 2019 – December 2019

- 12 actors were involved in the regular drama shows and rehearsals
- in 2019 DBD in total had 18 drama shows, at least one show in each calendar month
- safe and stimulating environment for DBD actors and actresses was created via rehearsals, performances, and interactions with the audience.
 We have increased actors and actress's self-confidence, social skills, and kinetic abilities. DBD educated them artistically and informally
- short discussion among spectators with DBD actors / actresses took place after drama shows

- by financially rewarding actors and actresses for their theatrical work in rehearsals and performances, we have improved their financial situation
- by regular shows, DBD put in spotlight the artistic work of homeless people and people with physical disabilities
- homeless people and people with disabilities have become those who offer and give something to others – the public, the audience
- homeless people who are actors and actresses in our theater aided actors and actresses with physical disabilities
- DBD used the funds from donations received in 2019 to pay a reward to an actor (homeless person) for helping an actress with a severe disability

THE HERO'S JOURNEY 2019

The main objectives of the project:

Organize and lead an international training Cesta hrdinu – The Hero's Journey. The Hero's Journey is a weekly drama therapy process, which builds mainly on the work of Paul Rebillot, but also Joseph Campbell, C. G. Jung, Manfred Weul, Helga Weule, and others.

June – November 2019

Place of event: Surya centrum, Brestové, Moravské Lieskové, Slovakia

Main project activities:

- training preparation
- arrangement of international training

Project results:

- 9 participants of the training completed the whole The Hero's Journey process
- supervisor, senior facilitator, junior facilitator, and assistant facilitators accompanied the participants through the whole The Hero's Journey and at the same time underwent further education in the topic of The Hero's Journey

CHILDREN FOR BRATISLAVA

The main objectives of the project:

Organize and lead the activities of the project, which is covered and organized by the MIB (Metropolitan Institute of Bratislava). Children from Bratislava primary schools will participate in non-formal education activities with an environmental or socio-artistic focus. DBD is responsible for the socio-artistic area.

Project duration:

June – November 2019

The most important activities within the project:

- preparation for organizing theatrical workshops and performances
- implementation of 8 theatre workshops where DBD actresses and actors became co-lectors
- realization of three theatrical performances with discussion

Project results:

- we organized educational workshops and performances for students and primary school students from Bratislava
- for the first time, together with the actresses and actors of our theatre, we worked with children in an experimented way and made a significant contribution to the sensitivity of all involved
- actresses and actors of the theatre became co-lectors of theatre workshops
- children and pedagogues reflected workshops and performances in retrospect – DBD obtained interesting and sensitive feedback (verbal and artistic)



The project was financially within the competence of the Metropolitan Institute of Bratislava.
